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SHAHIR ANNABHAU SATHE JAYANTI LOKMANYA TILAK PUNYATITHI

Date- 01 August 2026

On the solemn occasion of Lokmanya Tilak Punyatithi and Shahir Annabhau Sathe Jayanti held on 01st August 2026 at 4.30 PM in the Ground Floor Lobby of AESCOP, we gathered to pay heartfelt tribute to one of greatest patriots and visionaries. 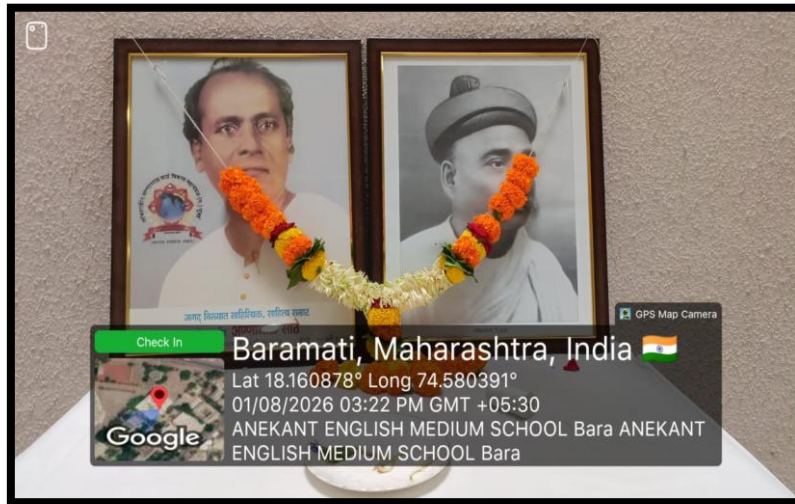

CPR TRAINING AND BLOOD PRESSURE CHECKUP TRAINING CAMP AT AEMS

Date- 01/08/2026

The CPR Training and Blood Pressure Measurement Training Programme was successfully organized on Saturday, 11 July 2026, at Anekant English Medium School, Baramati, as part of the collaborative initiative between Anekant English Medium School and Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy, Baramati. The programme was conducted in response to the implementation of CBSE Kaushal Vikas (Skill Education) for students of Grades IX and X with the objective of imparting practical healthcare skills, promoting emergency preparedness, and creating health awareness among school students.

The programme was coordinated by Ms. Sukanya Paricharak, Mrs. Namrata Gaikwad, Mrs. Charusheela Jagtap, and Mr. Ketan Mehta (Technical Coordinator). Diploma in Pharmacy student volunteers actively assisted in conducting demonstrations, supervising practical sessions, and guiding the participants throughout the programme.

A total of 110 students participated enthusiastically in the training programme. The session commenced with an overview of emergency response, the importance of Basic Life Support (BLS), and the role of first responders in saving lives during medical emergencies. Students were sensitized to recognize emergency situations, seek timely medical assistance, and understand the importance of immediate intervention in cases of cardiac arrest.

A comprehensive Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) training was conducted using CPR manikins. Faculty members first demonstrated the complete CPR procedure, including assessment of scene safety, checking responsiveness and breathing, activation of emergency medical services, proper hand placement, correct chest compression technique, recommended compression depth and rate, rescue breathing concepts, and the role of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). Following the demonstration, all 110 students participated in hands-on practical training, where they individually practiced chest compressions and the complete CPR sequence on the manikins under the close supervision of faculty members and trained student volunteers. Individual guidance and corrective feedback were provided to ensure proper technique, posture, compression depth, and rhythm, thereby improving the students' confidence and competence in performing CPR.

The Blood Pressure Measurement Training included an interactive session on the principles of blood pressure, normal and abnormal blood pressure values, hypertension, preventive healthcare, and the importance of regular monitoring. Faculty members demonstrated the correct method of measuring blood pressure using sphygmomanometers and stethoscopes, emphasizing patient positioning, cuff selection, cuff placement, identification of Korotkoff sounds, recording systolic and diastolic readings, and interpretation of results. Each participant was then given the opportunity to perform hands-on blood pressure measurement in pairs under direct supervision. Faculty members and student volunteers observed every participant, corrected procedural errors, and provided individualized guidance to ensure accurate measurement techniques and proper handling of the equipment.

The programme followed an experiential learning approach, where demonstrations were immediately reinforced through supervised practical exercises. This hands-on training enabled every student to actively perform both CPR and blood pressure measurement, transforming theoretical knowledge into practical skills. The interactive nature of the sessions, combined with continuous mentoring, significantly enhanced students' confidence in applying these essential healthcare techniques.

The active participation of Diploma Pharmacy student volunteers greatly contributed to the success of the programme by facilitating small-group practical sessions, ensuring adequate individual attention, and promoting peer-assisted learning. Their involvement also highlighted the importance of community service and healthcare outreach among future pharmacy professionals.

Overall, the collaborative programme successfully achieved its objectives of equipping 110 school students with fundamental life-saving and basic clinical skills through demonstration followed by extensive hands-on training. The initiative strengthened academic collaboration between the institutions under Anekant Education Society, promoted skill-based learning in accordance with the objectives of CBSE Kaushal Vikas (Skill Education), and empowered students with practical competencies that can be effectively utilized during medical emergencies and in routine health monitoring.

This version specifically highlights that every one of the 110 students performed hands-on CPR practice and hands-on blood pressure measurement, making it suitable for NAAC, PCI, IQAC, and activity report documentation.

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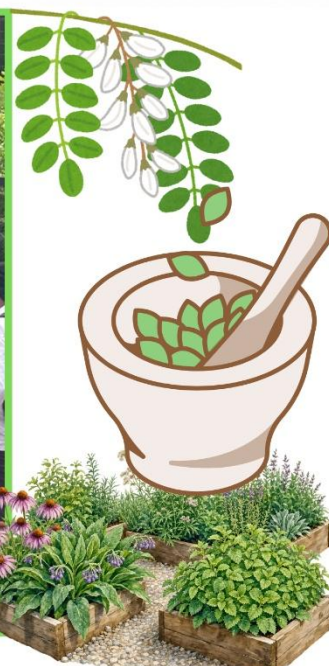


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**STRESS FREE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Date- 04 August 2026

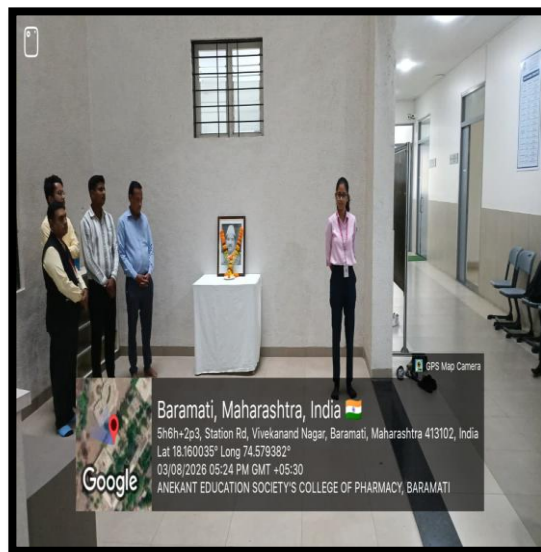
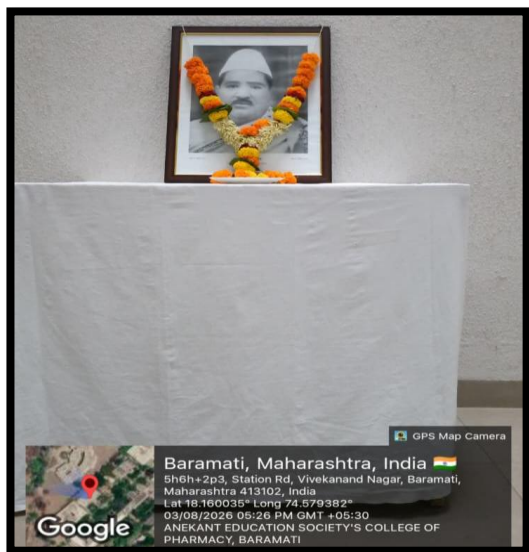
Kranti Sinh Nana Patil Jayanti is celebrated on 3rd August to honour the birth anniversary of Nana Patil, a prominent freedom fighter and social reformer from Sangli, Maharashtra. Born in 1900, he is renowned for leading the *Prati Sarkar* (Parallel Government) during the Quit India Movement, which governed over 1,400 villages in the Satara district from 1943 to 1946. A strong advocate of farmers' rights, caste equality, and grassroots governance, he also became the first MP to speak in Marathi in the Indian Parliament. He played a key role in India's freedom struggle by establishing the *Prati Sarkar*—a parallel government that operated in over 1,400 villages during British rule.

(FATHER OF LIBRARY IN INDIA)**

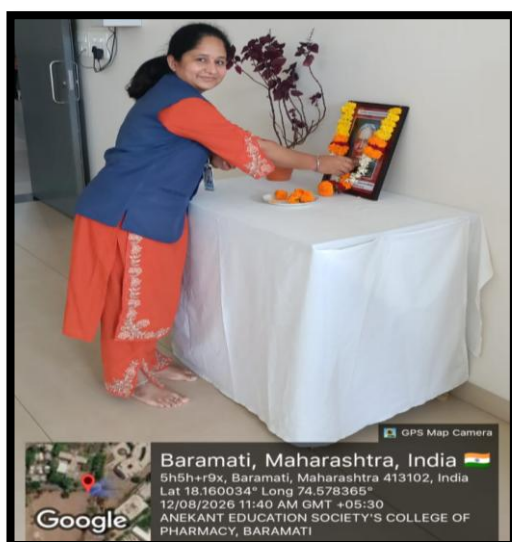
Date- 12 August 2026

On 12th August 2026, *Dr. S.R. Ranganathan Jayanti* was observed at Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy, Baramati to honour the Father of Library Science in India. Dr. Ranganathan (1892–1972) made remarkable contributions to the field of library science by formulating the Five Laws of Library Science (*Books are for use, Every reader his/her book, Every book its reader, Save the time of the reader, The library is a growing organism*), introducing the Colon Classification System, and promoting library education and the public library movement in India. He served as the first librarian of the University of Madras, later as Professor at Banaras Hindu University and the University of Delhi, and played a key role in establishing the Indian Library Association and Documentation Research and Training Centre (DRTC), Bangalore.

On this occasion, faculty and students remembered his legacy, discussed the importance of libraries in education and research, and resolved to make effective use of library resources for academic and personal growth.

The program concluded with a collective pledge to utilize the library resources and personality development book distribution to the students effectively for research, innovation, and holistic learning.

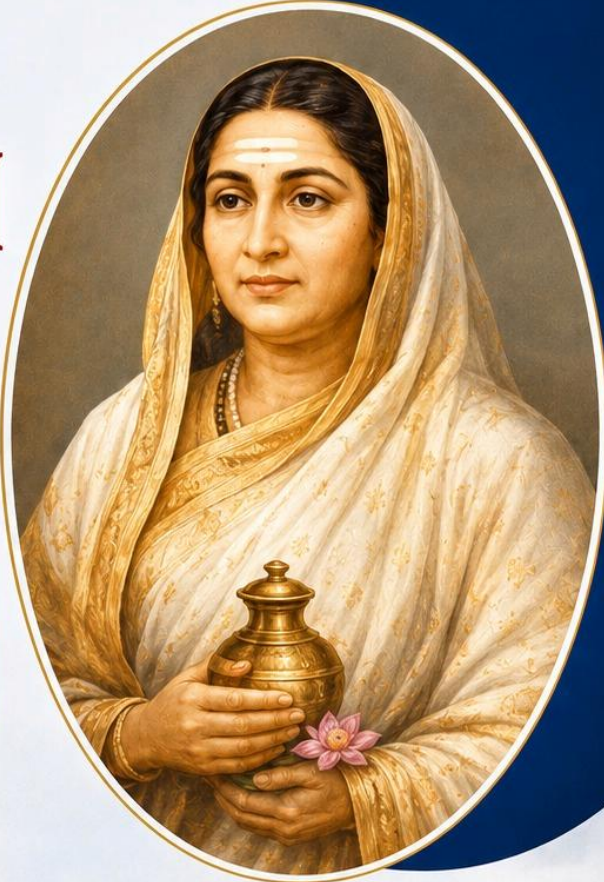

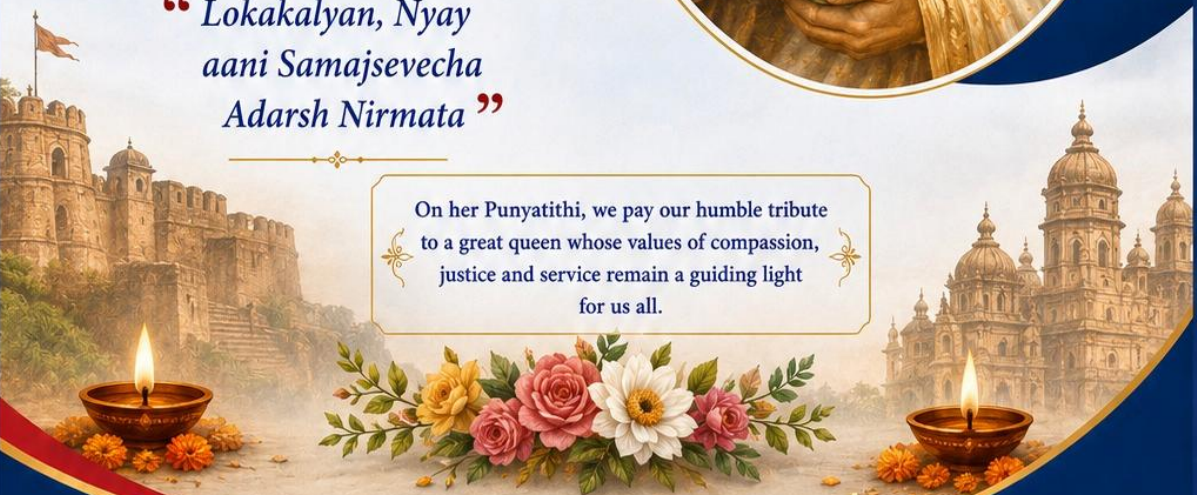

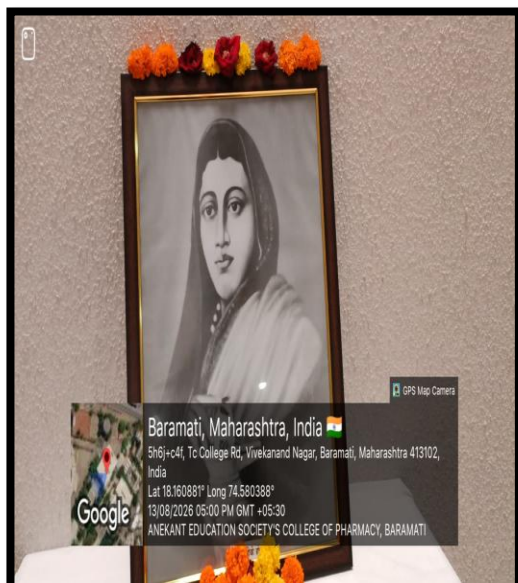

Kranti Veer Shivram Hari Rajguru (24 August 1908 – 23 March 1931) was one of India's most valiant freedom fighters who sacrificed his life at a young age for the country's independence. Born in Khed, near Pune (now renamed as Rajgurunagar in his honour), Rajguru was deeply influenced by the revolutionary ideas of Bal Gangadhar Tilak and other nationalists. From an early age, he displayed a spirit of patriotism and courage, dedicating himself to the struggle against British rule.

On the occasion of Kranti Veer Rajguru Jayanti, we have assembled here today to pay homage to the great revolutionary Shaheed Shivram Hari Rajguru, whose life was a true symbol of courage and sacrifice for our nation's freedom. Though his birth anniversary fell on Sunday, 24th August 2026, due to the holiday it has been arranged on Monday, 25th August 2026, so that all students and faculty could come together to honour his legacy collectively.

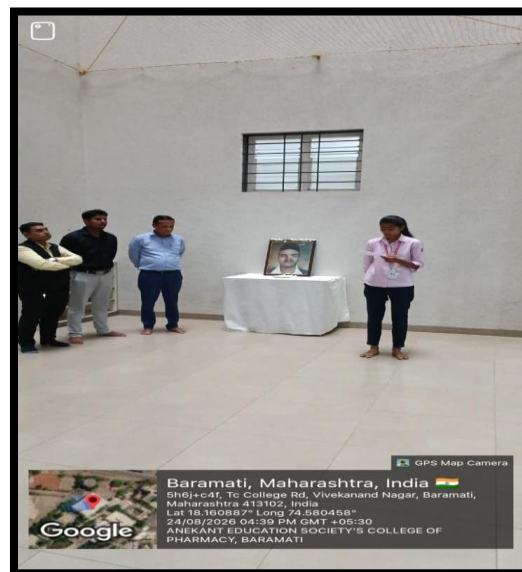
