MAHATMA GANDHI JAYANTI

Date- 02/10/ 2025

Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti is celebrated every year on 2nd October to honor the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi (Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi), the Father of the Nation. Born in 1869 at Porbandar, Gujarat, Gandhi devoted his life to truth, non-violence, and freedom for India. Through movements like Non-Cooperation, Civil Disobedience, and Quit India, he mobilized the masses against British rule and played a key role in India's independence struggle.

The day is observed across India with prayer services, tributes, and cultural programs. It is also recognized as the International Day of Non-Violence by the United Nations since 2007, spreading Gandhi's universal message of peace and harmony.

The Anekant Education Society's College of Pharmacy (AESCOP) organized a program to commemorate the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation. Although Gandhi Jayanti is observed nationwide on 2nd October, the celebration at AESCOP was preponed to 1st October 2025 due to the national holiday on 2nd October.

The program commenced with the garlanding of Mahatma Gandhi's portrait and offering floral tributes, followed by a prayer and bhajan that reflected Gandhiji's philosophy of truth and non-violence. Faculty members highlighted Gandhiji's life, principles, and his role in India's independence struggle. Students delivered speeches and recited quotes emphasizing the importance of non-violence, simplicity, cleanliness, and moral values in present-day society.

Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam Jayanti is celebrated every year on October 15 to honor the birth anniversary of Dr. Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam (1931–2015) — one of India’s most respected scientists, visionaries, and the 11th President of India. Popularly known as the “Missile Man of India,” Dr. Kalam played a pivotal role in India’s missile development and space research programs, including the Agni and Prithvi projects.

Born in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu, into a humble family, Dr. Kalam rose through dedication, education, and hard work to become a key figure in India’s defense and aerospace sectors. His life is an inspiring example of perseverance, simplicity, and service to the nation.

A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Jayanti was celebrated as “Vachan Prerna Din” on 15th October 2025 at 4.00 pm in the Library, First Floor, Anekant Education Society’s College of Pharmacy, Baramati.
